BRIDGING THE GAP THROUGH DIGITAL LITERACY



We are running 5 Computer learning centres. The mission of Computer Education project is to make a positive difference in the lives of children primarily through educating them & achieving the highest standard of career-focused education & particularly it's a boon for those who are living in remote location.

“In an effort to spread computer literacy and bring about rapid awareness at the doorsteps of far flung areas, Fair Farming Foundation is operating two computer centers at Sonapat (HR), one at Bahraich (UP), one at Chhatarpur (MP) and one at Hardwar (Uttarakhand). “For a community where computers are a dream, availability of such opportunity is almost heaven-sent”.

All the locations we selected are very remote, where the light of high tech civilization has never reached the aspiring children of the society. Not surprisingly, these places do not offer any computer education in nearby schools or as a privately-funded learning opportunity. The nearest facilities that offers any of the sort is around 5 Km away.

With the efforts of Fair Farming Foundation, children are now getting a chance to learn computers and they can dream of competing with other world. For many beneficiaries, it was the first time they have seen a computer.

Ms Pooja, a computer diploma holder got the employment in the village itself as a trainer for computer centre. ***She said “I live with my widowed mother along with my two sisters . I always wanted to supplement the family income & I am very happy today because I am earning from this centre as a part time trainer. My family is very happy and keep appreciating my efforts. I am thankful to Fair Farming Foundation for opening computer centre in our village as it empowered a simple village girl like me. There are many other students like me who would like to acquire some skill and help their families. I am so happy, Fair Farming Foundation is tapping their talent.***

The volunteer team too has grown and they are inspired to do more. In 2016-17, The course is being taken by around 220 students. The number of students enrolled may sound less but considering the geographical location & how remote the villages are, it's a big achievement. But we are still aiming high to reach out to every children in nearby villages.

ENSURING EQUITABLE & EQUAL ACCESS TO QUALITY EDUCATION



Till date we have adopted 6 Schools integrated child development & learning. We are making a difference by increasing access to school for the most disadvantaged children, and improving infrastructure and facilities in these school communities to ensure adequate and safe learning environments which contribute to improved learning outcomes.

The foundation is working towards strengthening the government school education system, through multi-faceted programs that have significantly contributed to further dreams of many children, families and communities. The Foundation's school education initiatives focus on core areas – whole school turn-around, and learning enrichment

FFF is working to ensure that the poorest and most marginalised children can go to school, and can have access to a quality school education. Initially we have taken four schools in Madhya Pradesh, Haryana & Uttarakhand which are providing education to the Minorities, Economically disadvantaged, girls, socially backward for holistic quality improvement focused on improving infrastructure & learning outcomes.

Poor primary school infrastructure in rural area is one of the major barriers to improving access to primary education in India. Empirical data show that physical facilities are an important factor in both school attendance and achievement. For this reason, improving primary school infrastructure is a high priority. Under Promoting Education initiative, our aim is to show how a school can become the hub of community life in a village. In our school the artificial boundaries that exist between home and school, between work and study, between life and learning – can be dissolved. Through our efforts we are bringing dry classroom subjects closer to life.
